Welcome and Introductions

The **Independent Oversight Committee** (IOC) members introduced themselves. Diedra (De) Freedman, Brad Doyle, Bernadine Henderson, Julie Heineking, Laurene Zemis, Pat Thundercloud, Cynthia Macluskie, Pamela Gradv

Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) Staff: Jeffrey Yamamoto (DDD IOC Liaison), Jaime Reddy (DDD Community Engagement Manager) Desi Preciado (DDD Criminal Justice Liaison) Michelle Pollard (DDD NCI coordinator introduced themselves.

Call to Public Committee

Discussion

De Freedman: Announced for Call to the public,

Laurie Ganzermiller: Introduced herself to the committee as the Director of Special programs for United Health Care (UHC). She oversees the IOCs for UHC. She thanked the committee for inviting her to the meeting. She mentioned that Sophia Legaspi typically will attend the meetings as the UHC IOC administrator and she's just filling in.

DDD Criminal Justice Liaison

Desi Preciado

Discussion

Desi Preciado: Started off by stating that she is tracking 35 total members in the state currently incarcerated or recently incarcerated and only 9 are from District West. With 8 Adults and 1 minor who recently transferred from Maricopa County Sheriff's Office Jail (MCSO) to the Durango facility. Two of the Adults are still at the Department of Corrections (DOC) the other 6 are out but are being monitored by the DDD Liaison. Making sure that they are receiving services or remain eligible.

De Freedman: Confirmed that a member with a guardian can still be arrested even if non-verbal and IQ of a 4-year old?

Desi Preciado: Confirmed that statement.

Bernadine Henderson: Asked what type of incidents are the members being incarcerated for? Also, what type of crime would a non-verbal be arrested for?

Desi Preciado: Answered that it varies from case to case, there have been kidnapping (forceful detainment) to sexual misconduct (sending sexual pictures to a minor over the internet). Non-verbal can be arrested for assault on a person.

Bernadine Henderson: Asked why a member with diminished capacity be incarcerated for any time?

Desi Preciado: Explained that they may be arrested but not serve any significant time due to a process of determining their mental incapacitation called "Rule 11". This is when the member is evaluated by two different



psychological professionals to determine if they can defend their actions or know if they can be determined incompetent to go to trial.

De Freedman: Informed the committee on the prior year incident that a minor under the Department of Child Safety (DCS) did not get a Rule 11 until he became an adult at age 18 and was able to call for a Rule 11 as an adult and get out.

Brad Doyle: Asked in a scenario, if all the paperwork show the incapacitation for a member can it be used to fast track to the courts in a Rule 11 proceedings.

Desi Preciado: She wasn't sure but will get back with the answer. But by statutes need two evaluations from the independent psych evaluators for Rule 11. She commented on her usual process for gaining reports and necessary information to send to both the jail and the public defender to best help the member.

Brad Doyle: Asked if the MCSO forward any Incident Reports to DDD for their records and it being reviewed by the IOC? Does Support Coordinators (SC) continue to serve member after they get out?

Desi Preciado: Reports "No" but will ask about this for MCSO. She commented that the same SCs continue to serve the member when they are released. Incarcerated members will have their benefits suspended while incarcerated.

De Freedman: Are there any Native American incarcerated? If they are a DDD member in a Native American jail would DDD be contacted?

Desi Preciado: Answered that "No" currently on any incarcerated Native Americans and "No" DDD would not know if any were incarcerated in Native American jails unless SCs informed the Criminal Justice Liaison. Desi does not have any Federal connections yet.

Discussion of letter to Assistant Director Cheryl Lovell

De Freedman: Informed the committee that there hasn't been a response from the Assistant Director nor Barbara Crawford.

ADOA Liaison Update

Discussion

Larry Allen: Informed the committee that the ADOA IOC manual is no longer available for public comment and that the final version is in front of the ADOA Director for his signature.

De Freedman: Asked if the email letter sent to Assistant Director Cheryl Lovell can be included on the annual report since there hasn't been a response yet.

Larry Allen: Acknowledged that if the committee agreed and it's voted in, it can be attached and can be included in the challenges of request. Larry stated he had not read the letter.



Voting on membership retention

Discussion

De Freedman: Began discussion on the two members (Michelle Lagas and Jennifer McNeil) who have been absent from meetings for 14 months without written or oral communications on their intended attendance for meetings. She suggested that a letter go out to ask for their resignation.

Pat Thundercloud: Suggested with their long absence that the committee just terminate their membership due to the Guidelines stating that if they miss 6 meetings in a 2-year period the committee can vote member off the committee.

Brad Doyle: Commented that asking for a resignation letter would not "leave a bad taste in their mouths" on being on the committee.

Bernadine Henderson: Agreed that the committee to vote to end their membership since there hasn't been any communications for over a year.

De Freedman: Asked the other members what they thought.

Committee: Agreed that they can be voted out, but a letter be sent to "Thank" them for their service.

De Freedman: Agreed to the compromise and would craft the letter for the two members and vote them out. She then asked for a motion.

- Bernadine Henderson: Seconded the motion.

Jeffrey Yamamoto: Commented that the DDD District West annual report is due by the end of the month. He said he was recently certified as an Article 9 instructor and wanted to let the committee know he's available for certifications.

De Freedman: Asked why the Quarterly Statewide IOC meeting was cancelled?

Jeffrey Yamamoto: Replied that no topics were sent in to be discussed and only De had replied on attendance.

Jeffrey Yamamoto: Introduced Jaime Reddy and Michelle Pollard to talk to the committee as DDD Staff updates.

Jaime Reddy: Began by informing that she is there because Sheri Wince of DDD asked the Community Engagement team to give a brief update of the October $1^{\rm st}$ Health Plan Transition. She handed out a PowerPoint presentation she uses to discuss the transitions. She briefly went over the handout. The integration is reported to be easier.

Bernadine Henderson: Asked about vendors balance billing of services. **De Freedman:** Informed her that if they are an AHCCCS registered provider it is illegal. If not, they can balance bill for what is not paid for. **Jaime Reddy:** Agreed to the statement.

De Freedman: Asked if anyone is tracking the successes in the case of determining and working with younger kids to get them off DDD services? **Michelle Pollard:** Informed the committee that that is what the National Core Indicators (NCI) can do. They are working to promote more success stories for the Division. Explained the data briefs from NCI.
